

## What is LOW VISION OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY?

**At VisionCorps, low vision occupational therapy (OT) provides services to clients with low vision diagnoses including:**

- Diabetic Retinopathy
- Retinitis Pigmentosa
- Glaucoma
- Age-Related Macular Degeneration
- Detached Retina
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Stroke



In order for someone to qualify for OT services, visual acuity in the better eye must be at least 20/70 or have a field angle of less than 20 degrees. Medicare B and other insurances are accepted.

**Occupational therapy assists clients with daily activities that may be difficult to complete due to low vision, including but not limited to:**

- Kitchen Safety (pouring liquids, measuring, cutting etc.)
- Reading (newspaper, recipes, finances, pictures, books etc.)
- Leisure tasks (puzzles, knitting, crochet, etc.)
- Medications (sorting, identifying)
- iPads, tablets, smart phones, smart glasses, computer accessibility and video magnifiers
- Education and training on optical and non-optical devices
- Organization, labeling, and tactile bump dot placement
- Community integration (outings to grocery store, bank, restaurants etc.)
- Eccentric viewing/PRL exercises
