**LANCASTER, Penna. (Aug. 28, 2023)** – The public is invited to an open house to see the new Technology & Accessibility Center (TAC) on Wednesday, Sept. 6, from 1-4 p.m. at [VisionCorps](#), 244 N. Queen St., Lancaster.

“Find out about new technology that can be very helpful to people with vision impairments,” said Dennis Steiner, President and CEO of VisionCorps. “This TAC open house is for anyone with vision loss and the people who support them.”

The public is invited to visit and try out low-vision solutions such as: task lighting, cell phone options, magnifiers, TV remotes, stove and microwave operation, kitchen tool prep, and white cane instruction. People can also learn about technology such as computer operation, software, apps, magnifiers, and some wearable technology solutions.

The TAC is used for individual assessments of clients who are blind or have vision impairments. It includes areas set up as a kitchen, living/family room, an office, and technology display area.
