The Enterprise Group focuses on employing people who are blind or vision impaired in manufacturing, food packaging, and administrative services, through both public and private sector contracts. Employment is available in Lancaster, Lebanon, and York Counties and our newest Little Rock facility.

Delineator posts – the reflective posts on the side of highways – were manufactured by employees who are blind at VisionCorps. The most prominent display of VisionCorps' work on these is on the Pennsylvania Turnpike.

As part of the Library of Congress' commitment to books and periodicals for the blind, VisionCorps' York facility provides the labor to process the cartridges and containers the NLS uses for the program.

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The Professional Services Division (PSD) personnel continue to be stellar performers within the AbilityOne program. PSD conducts research, reconciliation, and deobligation of excess funds, to be returned to the United States Department of Treasury consistently. Additionally, PSD provides personal and professional skill development for blind and vision impaired people to gain valuable skills and pursue their professional career paths. Lastly, PSD regularly identifies commercial prospects to aid in increasing our business line.
